I have developed a good relationship with a number of our legislators as CCSD Board President as well as my role with Alliant Energy so for me advocacy is something that I am comfortable with. Iowa schools are becoming both more diverse as well as having more students in need. I believe a display of more data showing this can do nothing but help our downward funding spiral. We have a lot of school districts doing innovation and creative things. I also believe showcasing more of this does nothing but help our cause. Another Important role of IASB is board learning. Regional meetings on public policy issues serves an important role, as does board requested training on how to be an effective school board member. As AEA President it is unclear the impact of AEA legislation will have on school districts, particularly our smaller districts.
