Below is a list of Do's and Don'ts for students as they display your projects and programs at the Capitol.

Do's





 Share about the district you are representing, as well as where it is in lowa (e.g., NW, NE, SW, SE, Central, etc.).



 Thank legislators for their work and interest in your school project/program.



 Demonstrate or explain any of your school's projects to legislators and other visitors at the Capitol.



 Talk about how the project or program has helped you or the students at your school.



 Answer questions legislators might have to the best of your ability. If you don't have an answer to a question, see if someone in your group might have the answer, perhaps the educator(s) present from your district.



Remember that you are representing your school and are not at the Capitol to lobby or discuss political issues with legislators or visitors.



 Don't give out any detailed personal information while you are at the Capitol (e.g., phone number, birthday, home address, email, social media contact information, etc.).



 Don't wear clothing with political or controversial messages.



Don't argue or enter debates
with Legislators or visitors at the
Capitol. If individuals attempt to
start a debate or argument with
you, do not hesitate to involve
the educators from your school
for assistance.



 Don't complain to legislators or visitors about elected officials or legislative actions.



 Don't distribute any political or advocacy literature while at the Capitol.
