UPDATES TO THE IASB ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION AND BYLAWS

The IASB Board of Directors recommends the following amendments to the IASB Articles of Incorporation & Bylaws. In summary:

- Language updates for greater clarity.
- Removal of associate membership as an option.
- Ability for IASB to offer limited services to non-members.
