On August 6, you received an email from Board President Elizabeth Brennan about proposed changes to IASB Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws. These proposed changes reflect both current and past practice for IASB.

Key proposed changes include:

- Language updates for greater clarity.
- Removal of associate membership as an option.
- Ability for IASB to offer limited services to non-members.
